As our organization continues to grow, we are expanding our programs to sustain and meet the essential needs of our community. Our current programs include rental assistance, clothing closet, winter shelter, and navigator support. In addition, we aim to set our sights on transitional housing starting in 2023 and beyond. Several HART groups that we partner with have already opened and operate Transitional Housing Units for local unhoused individuals. We are looking to further expand our partnerships with the City of Cirus Heights, Sacramento Self-Help Housing, Sacramento County, and our Faith Community to achieve our goal.

A Success

Rafael's journey is one that genuinely tugs at the heartstrings. A veteran who served his country, a musician who shared his passion with the world, and a dog owner who never gave up hope for a better future. His struggle to find work and housing amidst the COVID-19 pandemic left him and his family uncertain and desperate. For 33 long days, Rafael and his family had to call a hotel room their home. The situation was not ideal, and they knew they needed to find a more permanent solution. Thankfully, the Citrus Heights Outreach Navigator and HART came into their lives and helped turn things around.

With compassion and dedication, the Navigator worked tirelessly to find Rafael and his family a place to call their own. She recognized his need for help and utilized every resource at her disposal to get him back on his feet. Through her efforts, HART provided stability and hope, and Rafael was able to find a home for his family.

Winter Sanctuary

 The Winter Sanctuary is a temporary shelter program designed to provide homeless individuals with a warm and safe place to sleep during the winter months.

Neighbors Served

The 2021/2022 Winter Sanctuary served 77 guests in total. 8 guests found permanent housing. Many of our guests reconnected with family.

Cost

\$11,402 on supplies and upkeep

\$73,078 in donations of volunteer hours

\$4,575 in dinner and lunch donations



The Underground Clothing Connection

- The Underground is a clothing store that provides free clothing and household items to the Citrus Heights Community.
- The exchange is open two days per week and operated entirely by volunteers.

Neighbors Served

The Clothing Underground served **826** customers in 2022. **399** were new families in need of services. The exchange was open **52** weeks out of the year.

Cost

\$9,577 spent on new clothing

\$131,181 in donations of volunteer hours



Rental Assistance Program

 HART supports renters in the City who nee'ded assistance to avoid eviction and homelessness. The Rental Assistance Program (RAP) is our response.

Neighbors Served

- 19 households served in total
- 21 adults, 22 children
- Many adults are disabled and over the age of **65**All children served are under the age
- of 16 many are under the age of 4

Cost

\$24,149 in rental assistance provided

\$23,416 in volunteer hours



Citrus Heights HART in the **Community**

The Citrus Heights Homeless Outreach Navigator program aims to assist homeless individuals in our community. The program provides outreach services to homeless individuals, connects them with housing resources, and helps them access support services to meet their basic needs.

Neighbors Served

The HART partnership with the SSHH Outreach Navigation Team is making an impact.
